Highest Awards - SILVER AWARD

Become a Silver Award Girl Scout - after completing a Journey

Cadettes team up with a small group (4 or less) of Girl Scouts or go solo to find an issue they care about and then make a difference in their community, they can earn the Girl Scout Silver Award

- Starting October 1st 2023 anyone starting their Girl Scout Award going forward must follow the new Silver Award Guidelines. See the [Cadette Workbook for Earning Your Silver Award](#) as well as the [Adult Guide for Earning the Silver Award](#).
- A very big change to the process is Cadettes are required to complete a [Silver Award Project Proposal](#) in the very beginning of the process (work is not to start until the proposal has been approved). Pat Christie has agreed that Chatham Silver Award Project Proposals can be approved at the Service Unit level vs Council level for quicker turnaround time. Please send all Silver Award Project Proposals to silverawardschathamgs@gmail.com. Please put SILVER AWARD PROPOSAL and YOUR NAME in the subject



heading. Please make sure you get a reply back confirming receipt within one week. If you do not hear back please email Ceal Purschke at danceal9@aol.com. Silver Award project proposals will be turned around within one week. **(EXCEPT For the period 3/26 - 4/9)** The purpose of the project proposal is to set Cadettes up for success and make sure they have covered the Silver Award requirements -

- Addressing a Root Cause of their issue,
- Demonstrating Leadership
- Putting a plan in place to make their project Sustainable by
 - Creating a permanent solution that can be used after the project is complete.
 - Educating and inspiring others in the community or within the Girl Scout community to be part of the change
 - Advocating to change a rule, regulation, or a law and encourage others to join

A youth group visit consists of a one hour program on a Friday evening beginning at 7 PM. Half of the program is a classroom presentation on topics either of a general nature (e.g.- Star Gazing & Star Hopping - The Winter Sky) or of a specific interest (e.g. - introduction to the requirements for the Girl Scout Space Science Investigator Badge). The second half of the program is visiting the two domes and viewing the skies through our two telescopes (weather permitting).

Unfortunately all of our dates for the 2022-2023 Season (ending in May) have been reserved. The 2023-2024 Season begins in September and I already have a Priority List with 12 names waiting to be booked. The booking process will begin in late summer when we have our new Master Calendar constructed and approved.

If you would like to be added to the List, please let me know. Those on the List will receive updated information on the booking process as well as any news about our Youth Program. If you would rather not be added to the List, then I welcome you to visit Sperry on a Public Friday Night, from 7:30 PM to 10:30 PM. The Observatory is closed on the third Friday of the month (Sept. - May), holiday weekends, and for campus closings.

- Family Promise of Morris County - Volunteer Opportunities:

Shelter Program

Because more than half of our host congregations can no longer provide temporary shelter for our guests, we are continuing to shelter individuals and families in a motel. Currently, we are utilizing three rooms at the Extended Stay America just outside Morris Plains, and we plan to expand to seven rooms this year. Since moving our guests to the Extended Stay, congregations now have opportunities to engage with guests in person in the motel's Common Room. Volunteers can serve dinner, throw parties, have special evenings, or weekend time to play games, do crafts, haircuts, movie times, and so much more. Congregations have been enjoying connecting with the guests in a light, relaxed atmosphere where the guests feel special and have fun socializing.

Additionally, for volunteers who like to work behind the scenes, we need help prepping the motel rooms to include welcoming touches like throw blankets, food baskets, toiletries set up in the bathrooms, decorative touches, etc.

The connections and support with our shelter guests can carry over to their moves into their new homes. Volunteers can help prepare the home, help with the move, and check in after the move to see how the family is managing on their own. There are several congregational volunteers that have an on-going relationship with guests and consistently stay in touch and celebrate successes and milestones and are there for them through struggles as well.

Promising Solutions



The residents at our women's campus love to do activities with volunteers. They love the social aspect of it and want to feel connected to others. There are many opportunities to engage with, support, and create relationships with the Promising Solutions guests. We hold monthly birthday parties that can be hosted by a congregation, they love to play games, they enjoy self-care time like facials, nails, etc., they love outdoor activities like gardening and barbecuing, and crafting. They are really open to any type of activity because they love meeting new people. The connections can build from there. Alternatively, you can sponsor one home and support and form relationships with those four women.

Our Promise

Our drop-in center in downtown Morristown serves guests Tuesday-Wednesday, 1:00-3:00 pm. It's a big hit when volunteers come in and serve sandwiches, soup, or other types of lunches to the guests. We would like to begin a monthly game day where volunteers come in and play games with visitors of the center. During that time, we can also have movie time with snacks and possibly set up an area for creativity with art supplies.

Navigating Hope

Our mobile unit van goes out into Morris County areas to serve residents that cannot get to us. Volunteers can help hand out giveaways like snacks, toiletries, clothing, hats and gloves, and generally be there to help staff.

Community Support Program

Our Community Support Program includes individuals and families who have been housed. We would like to build a support network for these guests, as many times after families are housed, they feel nervous and anxious about being on their own and the responsibility that entails, especially if coming from the Shelter Program where they have been well taken care of for months. Community Support Guests sometimes need assistance with learning how to budget and save, how to manage outlier type expenses like a new tire for car or clothes for a new job, or just want a connection to someone for guidance.

Specialty Programs

We have a few programs during the year that provide both behind-the-scenes opportunities and time to engage with families.

Spring Baskets – we receive spring baskets from several donors that are for the children in all our programs. They need to be organized, labeled, and grouped together according to family. This takes place over several days. Then the baskets are handed out to families at the day center.

Back-to-School Fair – hundreds of school supplies and backpacks are donated for all students in our programs. Like the spring baskets, the stuffed backpacks need to be organized, labeled, and grouped together by family. Also, we need help with filling the empty backpacks with school supplies and then organize them. This also takes several days to complete and then handed out at our day center.

Holiday Gift Fair – This is our largest specialty program. We receive donated gifts and gift cards for several weeks prior to the holidays. The physical gifts need to be organized as we receive them and again during set up for the fair. We set up the fair inside the day center and have tables of household goods, toys, clothes, kitchenware, etc. The organizing takes a couple of weeks, and a third week is for families to stop by the day center and "shop", where we need more hands to help with shopping, surveys to be completed by families, and restocking tables.

Done-In-A-Day Service Projects



Projects for groups can be for a full day or half day. Service projects include beautifying the day center grounds, ie – planting flowers, trimming bushes, mowing grass, weeding, and more. Other projects involve deep cleaning the day center facility, organizing donations, helping with renovations, helping with a move for a family or individual in our programs, or preparing toiletry bags for Our Promise Outreach Center. We are also always open to suggestions of projects that will benefit those we serve.

Best Practices/FAQs

As questions and issues come up during the year, we will utilize this section as a place to remind leaders of GS guidelines. If you have issues that come up and need clarification, please let us know and we'll try to include them here. From questions and feedback last year, here are a few pieces of guidance.

- 1) You should have a (non-leader) parent be your treasurer.
- 2) Alcohol is NOT allowed at any event where girls are present (this particularly applies to camping and overnights!)
- 3) Troops may NOT donate money to a charity or cause. Only donations of goods are allowed.
- 4) Make sure all your girls are registered and that you have parents update the Annual Permission Slip (www.gsnnj.org/forms).
- 5) If your girls are working on their Silver or Gold Awards and want to do fundraising (bake sale, etc), they must have participated in the most recent fall product sales and cookie sales.

General
